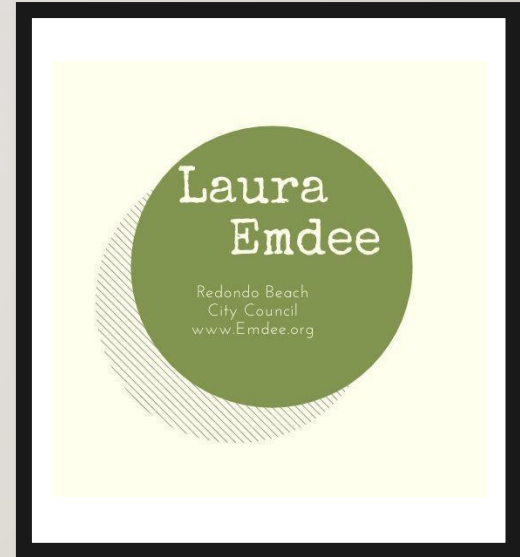

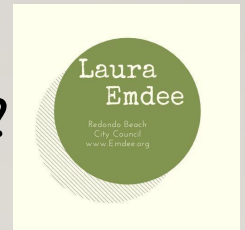
IS OUR RESIDENTIAL ROAD RESURFACING ON SCHEDULE?

- This year's roads are scheduled to be completed by July. (First year)

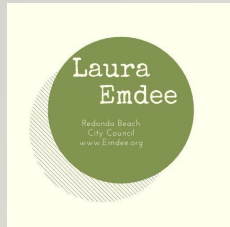


CAN WE GO BACK TO NORMAL YET?

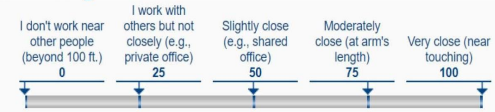
- Safer at Home is not sustainable.

Work Context: Physical Proximity

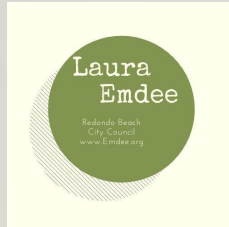


Extent this job requires workers to perform job tasks in close physical proximity to others

NEXT STEPS



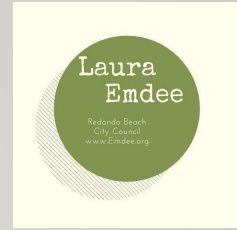
With precautions and design changes:

Maintain mask requirements, for now

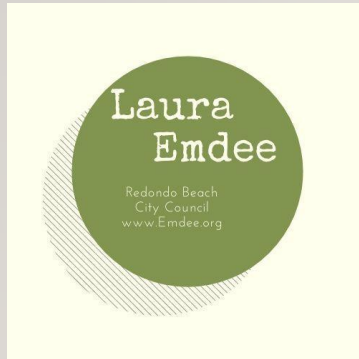
STATE OUTLINED 6 STEPS



-
- The ability to monitor and protect our communities through testing, contact tracing, isolating, and supporting those who are positive or exposed
 - The ability to prevent infection in people who are at risk for more severe COVID-19
 - The ability of the hospital and health systems to handle surges
 - The ability to develop therapeutics to meet the demand
 - The ability for businesses, schools, and childcare facilities to support physical distancing
 - The ability to determine when to reinstitute certain measures, such as the Stay At Home Orders, if necessary

FIRST STEPS:



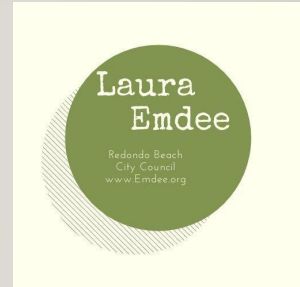
- Expand testing for the virus and for antibodies.

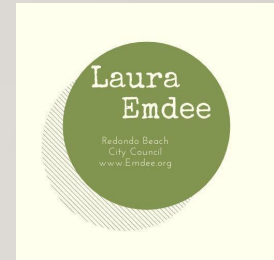
WHY WAS THE NORTH RB BIKE PATH SHUT DOWN WHEN THERE WERE NO CLEAR VIOLATIONS?

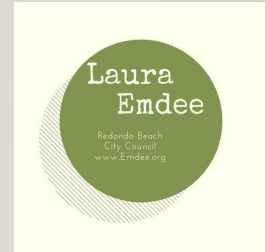
CAN WE INSTALL BIKE CORRALS AT SCHOOLS?

- All the schools have a bike corral that is locked during school hours.

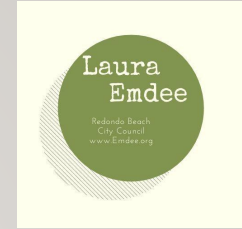


AES POWER PLANT

- Mandated closure is December 31, 2020
- State Water Board is considering allowing an extension
- City of Redondo has been pursuing grants and financing district to buy a AES land for a park.
- City Council directed the City Attorney's office to express the City's adamant opposition to any extension of the AES Redondo Beach Generating Station
- New owner is asking for Redondo to withdraw it's opposition in exchange for open space that is preserved as a covenant on Title



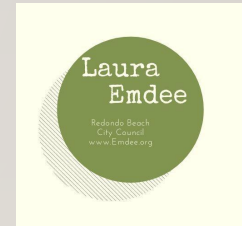
DO WE NEED THE POWER?

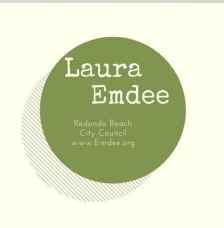
ARE YOU SURE WE DON'T NEED THE POWER?

- The Staff Report states repeatedly that the Alamitos, Huntington Beach, Ormond Beach and Redondo Beach plants are expected to run at or below their current operating capacity; which, since 2016, has been at just 4.8% capacity, then removing the comparatively small RBGS should not have an adverse effect on grid reliability.
- The closure of RBGS, which can produce 848 MW, can easily be covered by the unused capacity of the larger plants. For example, Alamitos can produce 1,163 MW; Ormond Beach can produce 1516 MW

WANT TO OPPOSE OR SUPPORT?
CITY OF REDONDO IS OPPOSING



- The public hearing will be in July
- The State Water Board is proposing to amend the Water Quality Control Policy on the Use of Coastal and Estuarine Waters for Power Plant Cooling (Once-Through Cooling or OTC Policy) to extend the compliance dates for Alamitos, Huntington Beach, and Ormond Beach generating stations for three years until December 31, 2023, and **Redondo Beach Generating Station for one year through December 31, 2021**, to address system-wide grid reliability concerns.
